管理 ID: English is the most important language in international business, education and mass media, and is spoken by as many as 1,500 million people in the Expanding Circle countries. As the term 'expanding' suggests, the number of speakers there increases every year. At the same time, the varieties of English spoken by non-native speakers are different not only from standard L1 English, but from each other, reflecting the speakers' mother tongue and socio-cultural background.

> The fall semester of this seminar sheds light on foreignaccented English with reference to the status of English in each non-native English speaking country. The approach to the phonetic features of NZE in the spring semester will become a model for comparing these L2 varieties of English.

[Goal]

By the end of the course, students will:

1 learn the current use and status of English in the Expanding Circle,

2 understand the diversity of English in Expanding Circle,

3 recognise the phonetic features of each variety of L2 English, 4 get used to analysing recording materials for research purposes.

[Course Description]

Students are assigned to 'lecture' about each variety of L2 English: the current use of English in that nation and the phonetic features as analysed from sound recordings of that variety. In this seminar, the teacher is more of a facilitator to assist and advise students when necessary.

The information management skills which students will learn in the course may improve their employability.
