We will continue exploring the issues related to the self and culture but more emphasis will be placed on actually planning independent research. Students will design an experiment or a survey to empirically examine their own research question related to the self and culture. To do so, they will be required to search relevant research on their own and integrate this in their study.

[Goal]

The overarching goal of this seminar is to further examine various issues related to the self and culture. A more concrete goal is to develop students' ability to conduct empirical research, from generating hypothesis to writing up a research paper. This course will improve students' employability skills in developing hypotheses and critically assessing information.

[Course Description]

Students will read, discuss, and apply research and theory on the self and culture. Class time will focus primarily on students' independent research projects. Students will present their hypotheses, their study designs, and materials. Class time will be devoted on discussing and providing feedback to each other's research. Students will be expected to spend additional time outside of class to collect data. The method of learning will involve presentations and discussions. Each student will be required to advance their own research and come to class prepared to discuss them.
