■講師: Professor Dyron Dabney

Dyron Dabney, granted his Ph.D. in Comparative Politics by the University of Michigan, is Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science at Albion College, Albion, Michigan. His research includes campaigns and elections, political parties, political participation and elite politics in Japan. He is currently a Visiting Professor at the School of International Liberal Studies at Waseda University.

■講演要旨

In this lecture, Prof. Dabney focuses on the supportive (or unsupportive) role played by both female and male spouses in the Japanese electoral process. While the spouse frequently is credited as being the better part, or the more valuable half of a partnership in everyday life, the spouse, as a partner within the context of a political life, often is undervalued as a political asset, operative, or "broker" of votes in the electoral arena by those who organize campaigns, as well as by those who observe them. He evaluates the participatory role and participatory consequence of the spouse—labeled the "spousal effect"—in local-, state- and national-level election campaigns in Japan. He establishes a number of spousal support "types" or categories via interview with female and male spouses and their corresponding legislative seat-seeking counterpart, and participant observations and media analyses of the actions of spouses. Prof. Dabney exposes the complexity of the spouse's participation in and influence on election campaigns based on geographic region, generation/age, sex, political party membership, voter expectations, tenure in office and the level of elected office.
